## Issues, Events and Updates

City Nature Challenge Calgary, Apr 26 -29
Become a citizen scientist and help Calgary compete in 2019 City Nature Challenge! The city of Calgary will be under a total BioBlitz April 26-29 and will compete with over 160 cities worldwide. The aim is to document as much urban biodiversity as possible so that we can better understand our local urban ecosystem. Cities worldwide will compete in three categories: The Number of Observations made, The Diversity of Species observed, and the Number of Participants.

Get outside, explore, take photos, and learn! We are documenting everything that calls Calgary home (Insects, Fungi, Plants, Birds, Fish, Reptiles, Mollusks, Amphibians, Arachnids, Mammals, Microorganisms, EVERYTHING!). You are welcome to join one of the free and family-friendly nature events we will host throughout the city or you can explore the city on your own (your garden, backyard, alleyway, schoolyard, sidewalk, playground, alleyways, parks, etc).

Observations are made by uploading photos to iNaturalist.ca. Download the free app on your smartphone or upload photos on your desktop. iNaturalist is a citizen science platform that connects naturalists from around the world. These naturalists will help

1) Photograph flora or fauna on your phone or

camera within Calgary's city limits.

2) Upload your photos to iNaturalist.ca on your phone or desktop before midnight April 29!!
\*Mark any captive/cultivated organisms (i.e. planted garden or animal at the zoo)

3) Learn about what you found and connect with Calgary's urban ecosystem.

Observations must take place anywhere within Calgary's city limits April 26-29.

May 28th 6 birders counted over 700,000 warblers passing through Tadoussac! Until now this has been a relatively unknown destination for birders. Anne will speak briefly about the real tourist attraction in Tadoussac - whales, and then look at bird migration (spring and fall)
