Position Overview:

 - Calgary & Region Bird Guide: Spearhead the creation of a Calgary & Region Bird Guide.
- **Stakeholder Engagement**: Collaborate with external partners, volunteers, and board members to ensure projects are resourced and supported.
- **Funding & Budget Management**: Work with the Treasurer to secure funding for special projects and ensure they are completed within budget.
- Reporting & Accountability: Provide regular updates to the board on project progress, key milestones, and any challenges faced.
